3.3.	Kart retrieval will be performed with retrieval vehicle with assigned Pit Crew and must only enter the Circuit when						
5.5.	permitted by the Grid Marshal or the Clerk of the Course and then only if wearing a HIGH VISIBILITY SAFETY VEST on the upper torso.						
3.4.	Karts can be retrieved via the grids at the discretion of the officials.						
4.	ADDITIONAL VENUE REQUIREMENTS						
4.1.	Subject to any applicable laws which may govern the access of animals, including but not limited to guide dogs, no						
	animals are allowed anywhere within the facility.						
4.2.	No dumping of Fuel or Tyres, please make your own arrangements.						
4.3.	No unlicenced driving of motor vehicles permitted at the Circuit.						
4.4.	No motorised scooters, mini bikes, roller blading, skateboards and tricycles allowed at the complex during the entire						
	Meeting. Officials may confiscate any such items for the duration of the Meeting.						
4.5.	Driving of karts in pit area is allowed to grid and from track. A slow constant speed must be kept.						
4.6.	If you have a large transport vehicle, please notify Race Secretary for entry access across the track instead of through the tunnel.						
4.7.	Marquees are not to be erected without consent of the Club.						
4.8.	No trailers and/or vehicles under pit shelters.						
4.9.	Loading and Unloading will not be permitted in the pit area thoroughfare while practice and racing is on.						
4.10.	Generators are allowed, please consider other guests when locating and operating.						
4.11.	Camping is permitted on Friday and Saturday night (refer to timetable for access).						
4.12.	Change rooms with hot showers are available.						
4.13.	A club room is available for bunking (1 st come 1 st served basis), bring your own bedding.						
4.14.	Canteen will be open – Sausage sizzle after racing Saturday.						
4.15.	No bar facilities available on site. BYO alcohol. NO Glass allowed.						
4.16.	D & E Grade licence holders must be scrutinized by an official.						
	SuperKartClubWA will allow a Come and Try session at the end of racing if time permits:						
4.17.	 People wishing to "Have a Go" in a friends or relatives kart, must sign an insurance indemnity form and comply with ALL KA regulations regarding this. Cadet age children can only use karts with MiniRok or Comer engines. Junior age children can only use karts with Restricted KA100 or Yamaha J engines. 						
	Seniors can only use karts with Yamaha J or Restricted KA100 engines , Yamaha S engines or						
	RESTRICTED 125 engines.						
	 All Have A Go drivers must be wearing a minimum of long pants (jeans), long sleeves, gloves and enclosed shoes. Race suits are recommended, but not compulsory. 						
	Come and Try session will be supervised by the clubs KA Officials.						







APPENDIX A

Rolling Starts

- (i) When the Grid Marshal signals for the Karts to be released drivers will be under "Starter's Orders".
- (ii) Whenever a Kart is stopped on the Track it is forbidden to receive any assistance, other than to remove the Kart to a place of safety.
- (iii) Drivers will complete one (1) rolling lap and one (1) formation lap prior to the Start signal being given.
- (iv) The rolling lap will end as Karts pass the grid apron the first time. The Driver on pole position must slow down immediately and maintain a constant speed and direction during the formation lap to allow the whole field to form up for the Start.
- (v) Drivers must maintain their grid position until the Start signal has been given and failure to do so may incur a penalty. Drivers who raise their hands unnecessarily may incur a penalty.
- (vi) A Driver who is delayed will have the possibility of regaining their grid position only if this manoeuvre does not impede other Drivers and in all cases before having reached the Red Formation line. It is forbidden to use any course other than the Track used during the rolling and formation lap in order to try and regain their position.
- (vii) If a Driver stops for any reason during the formation Lap, the Driver will not be allowed to try and start again until the whole field has passed them. That Driver will then start from the back of the formation. Should the Driver try to start ahead of the field in the hope that the leading Drivers overtake them, that Driver will be shown the black flag and be excluded from that Race.
- (viii) From the "Red Formation Line" it is forbidden to overtake another Driver, irrespective of the number of formation laps. The Driver on pole position shall set the speed (approximately 25% of race speed) at which all Competitors shall approach the Starting area in anticipation of the Start signal being given.
- (ix) The Starter will give the Start signal as the Drivers approach the Control Line only if he/she is satisfied with the formation and speed of the Karts. The static Green or National flag will signal the Start of the Competition.
- (x) A Driver will be permitted to accelerate only after the Start signal has been given.
- (xi) The Starter and Clerk of the Course will be considered as Judges of Fact during the start procedure.
- (xii) If the start is aborted a yellow light/flag and/or Chevron Flag will be displayed and the start procedure will be repeated.
- (xiii) Any driver who causes the start to be aborted may incur a penalty.







General Information

- Canteen will be open on Saturday.
- No bar facilities available on site. No glass. Animals are prohibited.
- Transponders are required for scoring.
- Have transponder number available on registration.
- P Plate drivers must be scrutineered by an official.
- If you have a large transport vehicle, please notify Race Secretary for entry access across the track instead of using the tunnel.
- Evening quiet time is from 10.30pm.
- Loading & unloading will not be permitted in the pit area thoroughfare during racing & practice. Vehicles can reach the adjacent "burnout area" with access behind the clubhouse where Karts can be unloaded.

Camping Information

- Camping is permitted and the venue has shower blocks and a clubroom that can be used for bunking.
- Bring your own bedding if using the clubroom. Camping can be setup in the camping & parking area (see photo below). Generators are allowed but be respectful of other campers.
- There is a club kitchen but it must be kept clean at all times. BBQ facilities are available on Friday night and a meal is provided on Saturday night. There are no bar facilities. <u>GLASS</u> containers prohibited.
- Stay the night and party under the stars!









Directions Travel to Collie by either Kwinana Freeway or South West Highway:-

<u>Kwinana Freeway</u>, continues onto the Forrest Highway. Travel south for 158km, and take the turn-off to Raymond Road, heading east until reaching the South West Highway. Turn left then immediately right over the railway line onto Coalfields Highway to Collie another 38km. Travelling time approximately two hours and 10 minutes.

If you take this route be aware that it is approximately 130km from Perth to the next fuel stop unless deviating to one of the towns along the route.

<u>South West Highway</u> : via Armadale, Byford, Serpentine, Pinjarra, Waroona, Yarloop, Harvey and Brunswick Junction. Turn left at Coalfields Highway through to Collie another 38km. Travelling time approximately 2 hours 30 minutes.

From Collie : Drive thru Collie and cross the river, continuing along the main road changing its name to Crossman Rd.

Turn right at Piavinnini Rd. where there are signs for the Motorplex, Motorcross, Power Station & Stockton Lake. Continue to the T junction and turn left onto Powerhouse Road with the Motorplex signposted further down on the right. Note: Piavinnini Rd. is immediately before the railway crossing when coming from Collie.

Entrance into the pits is under the track thru a tunnel. Trucks cannot enter this way. Please let us know if you have a truck so we can organise entry over the track. All trucks must have arrived before 8am on Saturday.

Trailer parking is available in the general pit area but excluded from the undercover pit area alongside the club rooms. Vehicles are to be parked in the Parking/Camping are. Overflow parking is available in the "burnout area".
