3.1.	Pit Crew with trolleys Will be given access to the Circuit during Qualifying and Racing.
3.2.	Retrieval of Karts is at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course
3.3.	Pit Crew must only enter the Circuit when permitted by the Grid Marshal or the Clerk of the Course and then only if wearing a HIGH VISIBILITY SAFETY VEST on the upper torso.
3.4.	Karts can be retrieved via the out grid
4.	ADDITIONAL VENUE REQUIREMENTS
4.1.	Subject to any applicable laws which may govern the access of animals, including but not limited to guide dogs, no animals are allowed anywhere within the facility.
4.2.	No dumping of Fuel or Tyres, please make your own arrangements.
4.3.	No unlicensed driving of motor vehicles permitted at the Circuit.
4.4.	No motorised scooters, mini bikes, roller blading, skateboards, bicycles and tricycles allowed at the complex during the entire Meeting. Officials may confiscate any such items for the duration of the Meeting.
4.5.	Marquees are not to be erected without consent of the Club.
4.6.	Enclosed shoes must be worn on the in and out grid at all times.
4.7.	Clear visors may be required.
4.8.	<p>If time permit Bunbury City Kart Club may allow a Come and Try session at the end of racing: People wishing to "Have a Go" in a friends or relatives kart, must sign an insurance indemnity form and comply with ALL KA regulations regarding this.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cadet age children can only use karts with MiniRok or Comer engines. • Junior age children can only use karts with Restricted KA100 or Yamaha J engines. • Seniors can only use karts with Yamaha J or Restricted KA100 engines , Yamaha S engines or • RESTRICTED 125 engines. • All Have A Go drivers must be wearing a minimum of long pants (jeans), long sleeves, gloves and • enclosed shoes. Race suits are recommended, but not compulsory. <p>Come and Try session will be supervised by the clubs KA Officials.</p>

5.3	Type B Structures as detailed in the TFS Rules (i.e. with a floor plan between 18 sqm and 36sq) Will be permitted to be erected at this Meeting. The Structure must be properly secured to the ground in accordance with the TFS Rules.
5.4	Unless specifically approved by the Organiser, Type C Structures Will Not be permitted to be erected at this Meeting.
5.5	All Structures must only be erected in areas approved by the Organiser
5.6	All Structures must be properly secured to the ground in accordance with the TFS Rules

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
